
HOW TO WRITE A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

WHAT IS A LETTER TO THE EDITOR (LTE)?

An LTE is a letter written to a specific news outlet regarding issues of concern from its readers. These letters are normally intended for publication and are often a response to an article, editorial, op-ed, or column previously published.





CONCLUDE BY STATING YOUR POINT & A CALL TO ACTION (IF APPROPRIATE)

BEFORE YOU SUBMIT AN LTE FOR PUBLICATION:



Make it relevant and timely.

- Cite the article you're referencing.
- Make sure you cite all your sources.



Check your facts.
